“For thus said the Lord GOD, the Holy One of Israel, “In returning and rest you shall be saved; in quietness and trust shall be your strength...”

May each Sunday throughout Lent be a time to rest our souls in His loving arms, and enjoy the sweet embrace of our Loving Savior who died to satisfy the penalty of sin, and grant us the renewal of rest as we worship and prepare for the week ahead.

“Is not this the kind of fasting I have chosen: to loose the chains of injustice and untie the cords of the yoke, to set the oppressed free and break every yoke?”

Fasting is intended to draw us closer to God and to enable us to “feel the suffering” that others experience all around us and across the globe. As you fast and pray ask the Holy Spirit to open your eyes to the harsh suffering that women in the 10.40 window endure.

“It was good for me to be afflicted so that I might learn your decrees.”

Fasting is a form of self-infliction to remind us of our humanity and of our need for God. Pray for a greater awareness of your need for a Savior, and of the wonderful loving Savior God our Father has sent to us – Jesus Christ our Lord. Pray that many will come to know Him this very year through the ministry of Women in the Window International.

“So as for you, return to your God, maintain kindness and justice, and wait for your God continually.”

Unless fasting leads to acts of kindness expressed through the fruit of the Spirit, it is counterproductive. But as we turn to God, following the example of Jesus in the wilderness (Matthew 4:1-4) we will be transformed to express the kindness of God and to wait for Him!

“So that your fasting may not be noticed by men but by your Father, Who sees in secret; and your Father, Who sees in secret, will reward you in the open.”

Jesus encouraged His disciples, and us, to fast. But He also cautioned us to guard our hearts and our motives so that our fasting is not done for others to see, but in the privacy of our devotion to God Himself. And, He promises that our Father who sees us in the secret places of our life and the intimacies of our heart, will reward us openly.

“So we fasted and sought our God concerning this matter, and He listened to our pleading.”

Fasting and prayer are always mentioned together in both the Old and New Testaments of the Bible. We don't fast for the sake of personal enlightenment or to grow into a state of personal enlightenment, we fast and pray to draw close and to pray to our God. And He always hears our prayers.

“Be still, and know that I am God; I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth.”

May this season of prayer, fasting and drawing near to God produce a confidence that comforts your soul and anchors your life in Christ alone. And may your prayers expand to cover the earth, and specifically the nations where Women in the Window is actively serving our ministry partners in Africa, Asia and the Middle East.
